TIP 1 – MAINTAIN YOUR PERSONAL BRAND

- LinkedIn Profile
- Business Cards
- Announce attendance at events so others know they can find you there.
- Think about others first. Makes networking more palatable to others.
- Consider your attire

TIP 2 – IDENTIFY INDIVIDUALS FOR TARGETED INTERACTIONS Review lists of presenters ahead of time and make a list of people you'd like to meet. Remember there is no chain of command, so long as you're respectful ■ Talk to the SCCE staff – they know everyone and are always helpful • Keep an eye out for folks who you see attending the same sessions as TIP 3 – DO EVERYTHING Pre and Post conference sessions are usually longer and often contain breakout activities which are great for meeting new people • Attend the social functions, including yoga, volunteering, tailgate, and cocktail hours ■ Talk to the vendors – they have solutions to your problems! TIP 4 - MAKE IT EASY Wear your name badge – easy recognition and conversation starter ■ Talk to folks 1:1 – easier than inserting yourself into a conversation already in progress Have some conversation starters prepared ahead of time ■ Talk to presenters after the session.
